-> chose the main desk as a "Bora Centipede" workbench because of sturdiness, also folding for people who constantly move around (like me)

- wanted enough space for the peripherals, wanted it to feel inspirational as well
- Wanted it to be tall enough to sit for the chair of choice :) (see later)

- re-used some extra foam floor tiles on the wall to feel like sound-proofing






- Keyboard and peripherals that help but, again, not too expensive


Chose a pair of M&D MH40 headphones mostly for their great retro look, chose the monitor as an ASUS ProArt 27 but the cheap edition which has great color accuracy but is only ~250 dollars, we added a loupdeck and a craft keyboard so no need for panels.
